

## MINUTES

ON MAY 1, 2023 AT 6:30 PM THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL HELD THEIR REGULAR SCHEDULED MEETING AT THE TOWN HALL COMPLEX. PRESIDING OVER THE MEETING WAS MAYOR BILLY CHAVIS. ALSO PRESENT FOR THE MEETING WERE COUNCILPERSONS DAVID BARBER, CYNTHIA FULLER, GEORGE SUMMERSON AND LEANNE TROUTMAN. MAYOR CHAVIS CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AND BEGAN BY PROVIDING THE INVOCATION. COUNCILPERSON TROUTMAN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS POSTED. COUNCILPERSON FULLER SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL VOTED IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION. COUNCILPERSON BARBER THEN MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 6, 2023 MEETING. COUNCILPERSON SUMMERSON SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL VOTED IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION.

TO BEGIN THE MEETING, MAYOR CHAVIS STATED THAT JUDGE KELLY MUCKENFUSS WOULD BE SWEARING IN KATE COPSEY AND TOMMIE BURKINS TO THE BOARD OF APPEALS COMMITTEE AS WELL AS SWEARING IN TOMMIE BURKINS TO THE HOLLY HILL ELECTION COMMISSION .

CHIEF JOSHUA DETTER READ THE PROCLAMATION FOR PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL DAY WHEREAS THE CONGRESS AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES HAVE DESIGNATED MAY 15, 2023 AS PEACE MEMORIAL DAY: AND WHEREAS THE MEMBERS OF THE HOLLY HILL POLICE DEPARTMENT PLAY AN ESSENTIAL ROLE IN THE RIGHTS AND FREEDOMS OF THE CITIZENS OF OUR COMMUNITY AND WHEREAS IT IS IMPORTANT THAT ALL OUR CITIZENS KNOW AND UNDERSTAND THE DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES, HAZARDS, AND SACRIFICES OF THEIR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS RECOGNIZE THEIR DUTY TO SERVE THE PEOPLE OF THIS COMMUNITY, BY PROTECTING THEM AGAINST VIOLENCE AND DISORDER; AND THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF HOLLY HILL POLICE DEPARTMENT UNCEASINGLY PROVIDE A VITAL PUBLIC SERVICE NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN OF HOLLY HILL DIRECTS THAT ALL FLAGS ON TOWN/COUNTY BUILDINGS BE FLOWN AT HALF-STAFF ON MAY 15, 2023 IN RECOGNITION OF PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL DAY AND IN MEMORY OF THOSE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS , WHO THROUGH THEIR COURAGEOUS DEEDS, HAVE MADE THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE IN SERVICE TO THEIR COMMUNITY OR HAVE BECOME DISABLED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTY, AND TO HONOR THOSE LAW ENFORCEMENT PRESENTLY SERVING THE COMMUNITY.

IN THE ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT ASSISTANT TOWN CLERK SHELIA WILLIAMS HAD NOTHING TO REPORT AT THIS TIME.

IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, CHIEF JOSHUA DETTER PROVIDED THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S MONTHLY STATISTICS REPORT. CHIEF DETTER THEN STATED THAT BOTH TRUCKS ARE COMPLETED AND THAT THE DURANGO IS NEXT TO BE COMPLETED ALSO CHIEF JOSHUA DETTER STATED THAT A GRANT WAS SUBMITTED FOR VEHICLE CAMERAS AND BODY CAMERAS FOR OFFICERS. CHIEF JOSHUA DETTER COMPLETED TRAINING FOR THE VICTIMS ADVOCATE THE WEEEEK OF APRIL 24-26,. AND IS NOW CERTIFIED.

IN PARKS AND RECREATION, COUNCILPERSON FULLER STATED THAT IT IS BASEBALL SEASON.

IN THE AIRPORT DEPARTMENT, COUNCILPERSON SUMMERSON STATED THAT IT WAS TIME TO MAINTAIN THE GRASS CUTTING AND LAWN MAINNTEANCE

IN PLANNING AND ZONING, DAVID TEAGUE STATED THE COMMITTEE WILL CONTINUE THE PERIODIC REVIEW COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ON THE NEXT MEETING MONDAY MAY 8 ,2023

IN THE BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS, MRS DIANE BERGEN STATED THAT THERE WAS NOT A MEETING FOR APRIL AND THE BOARD'S NEXT MEETING WILL BE MAY 15, 2023. ALSO TIFFANY CASON RESIGNED FROM HER POSITION ON THE BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS DUE TO PERSONAL MATTERS.

IN CODE ENFORCEMENT, GAYLE AUSTIN STATED THAT 4 BUILDING PERMITS WAS ISSUED AND 14 CONTAINERS HAVE BEEN REMOVED AS WELL AS 5-7 CARS IN THE TOWN OF HOLLY HILL AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO WORK TOGETHER TO MAKE THE TOWN LOOK BETTER.

IN THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, COUNCILPERSON TROUTMAN STATED SHE HAD NOTHING TO REPORT AT THIS TIME.

AT THIS TIME MAYOR AND COUNCIL WENT INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION UPON RETURNING MAYOR STATED AS OF MAY 1, 2023 TOWN CLERK PAMELA HYMAN WAS TERMINATED OF ALL DUTIES FROM BEING TOWN CLERK

THE FLOOR WAS THEN OPEN FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS (SIGN IN SHEET ATTACHED) BILLY CHUBB ASKED IF PAMELA HYMAN HAD A OPTION TO SPEAK AND THAT 18 YEARS IS A LONG TIME TO WORK FOR THE TOWN OF HOLLY HILL. LORETTA LYNARD ASKED IF WE COULD ALLOW HER TO USE THE OLD LIBRARY FOR A PRAYER CLOSET FOR OUR COMMUNITY. DAVID TAWES MENTIONED THE ROAD ON OLD STATE ROAD AGAIN AND THAT THE REPAIRS IS SOME WHAT PRESENTABLE,BUT HOW LONG WAS THAT GOING TO FIX THE PROBLEM . DR WALTER WANTED TO THANK GAYLE AUSTIN AND THE EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN FOR DOING A GOOD JOB AND CONTINUE ALL WE DO.
